## **Dear Parishioners**

On our Parish Pilgrimage to Salamanca some years ago you were all in our prayers. We followed in the footsteps of St Teresa of Jesus and St John of the Cross. Our base was in the Scottish College in Salamanca. From there we could walk into the city which was busy and beautiful. Most days we were out and about and visited the Royal English College of St Alban in Valladolid where Father Tony was based for many years. The college houses three libraries, one of which contains an incredibly ancient collection of books bound in pigskin.

We had Mass at The Convent of St Joseph in Avila founded by St Teresa who had a special devotion to him. The museum in the convent has many treasures including a tiny pencil drawing of Christ on the Cross sketched by St John of the Cross. The perspective is from above which is unusual. This little sketch inspired Salvador Dali's painting Christ of St John of the Cross housed in the Kelvingrove Art Gallery in Glasgow. Some years ago when I was working in Glasgow I called in to see Dali's painting. Sadly at that time it was on loan to London! It is still on my list of paintings to see.

Our trip took us to Segovia and we had lunch in a restaurant next to the famous Aqueduct, a fabulous structure. On that day on our way back to the Scottish College we visited the church in Alba de Tormes, which was opened especially for us. This is the church where St Teresa's remains are in a casket set high above the altar. There is a museum behind the altar and that's where my fellow pilgrims were headed. I went to light a candle first. Some of you will know that in some churches, because of health and safety, you place a coin in a box and an electric light goes on. I placed a one-euro coin in and...every single light bulb switched on. There was at least 60. I laughed a bit, then sobbed and felt compelled to kneel and pray. The prayer card I bought that day is reproduced below and St Teresa's prayer brings solace to me and many people.
