Sunday 29 September 2024 – Twenty Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Readings: Year B

Dear Parishioners

"He who is not against us, is for us." These are the words of Jesus in our Gospel today and they are well-timed in the hooha around the comments of Pope Francis to young people in Singapore. The Holy Father has been undertaking another mammoth travel, this time to four countries and two Continents: Indonesia, Papua New Guinea, Timor-Leste and Singapore. Not content with such a gruelling schedule, this 86-year-old Chief Shepherd, in poor health, has also popped into Luxembourg and Belgium on his way back home. In a session with young people from different faith backgrounds Pope Francis commented that all religions are paths or languages leading to God. Some commentators have seized on this as proof that he is preaching heresy and leading the faithful astray, but if you examine the Holy Father's words carefully you will see that he is not saying all religions are the same but that people come to God in many different ways.

The full revelation about God comes through His Son, Jesus Christ, and it is possible through "the shadows and images" of other belief systems to draw closer to the True God, be those other systems religious or secular. The Church is very clear on this and without detracting from the unique Person of Jesus, states that He can be found gradually in many different ways. Dialogue with mutual respect is a key to opening minds and hearts.

The great saints of the Church like Mother Teresa live out that commitment to openness and trust in the service of fellow humans. Their actions speak more than volumes of words!

Many thanks for all the prayers and support prior to and following my surgery. I was delighted to discover that Pope Francis had exactly the same operation last year!

Everyone is invited to join in this privileged visitation, to pray the Rosary and hear the story of Fatima including the messages of Our Lady of Fatima. There is a poster at the back of Church with timings.

Parish Pilgrimage 2025: For various reasons (mainly cost) the planned pilgrimage to Rome next year has been changed to a visit to Fatima and Lisbon. The date has also changed, from September to May around 11-16th. We're looking at convent accommodation in Fatima conveniently located near the Basilica and the opportunity to join the nightly torchlight procession, plus in Lisbon itself we can visit the Cathedral as well as the birthplace church of St Anthony, again with appropriate lodgings. Costs have yet to be determined precisely but we hope around £850 per person.
