**Pope's Prayer Intention for September – For the cry of the earth:** We pray that each one of us will hear and take to heart the cry of the earth and of victims of natural disasters and climatic change, and that all will undertake to personally care for the world in which we live.

<u>Peter's profession of faith:</u> We enter Part Two of Mark's Gospel (8:27-16:8). After having been consistently rejected and misunderstood despite all he has said and done, Jesus starts to proclaim the necessity of the suffering, death, and resurrection of the Son of Man in God's plan.

The First Reading talks about the Servant of the Lord who suffers, not in spite of his innocence, but because of it. But he is sustained in all his trials by the firm belief that God is with him. The suffering Servant represents the many suffering just people. The New Testament sees Jesus as Suffering Servant par excellence.

In the Gospel we have Peter's profession of faith. In response to that confession, Jesus makes a threefold discourse: that the Messiah must suffer, that his disciples must be prepared to share his suffering, and that his and their suffering will lead to ultimate glory.

**Evangelii Gaudium Sunday:** This weekend we celebrate 'Evangelii Gaudium Sunday', formerly known as Home Mission Sunday. It gives us the opportunity to reflect on the great mandate we have been given by the Risen Lord to evangelise the whole world.

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations," the Lord commissions, as we hear in Matthew 28:19.

Inspired by our ongoing Synodal process, Scripture, and Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium, we have chosen the theme 'Growing as missionary disciples'. On the day itself, we can encourage the faithful to pray for our parish communities, that they would become intentionally missionary in their life and witness.

A second collection will also be taken on Evangelii Gaudium Sunday to support the work of the Bishops' Conference Mission Directorate. Please hold this important work in your prayers.

Adoremus in Our Parish- This Weekend (15 Sept): As the Bishops of England and Wales have invited all parishes across our countries to have a period of Exposition to unite the faithful in focusing on the Eucharist in anticipation of the Jubilee Year with renewed and deepened devotion, there will be an hour of Eucharistic Adoration before the Masses this weekend. Parishioners are asked to come a little earlier and take part in the adoration.

<u>The Season of Creation:</u> Everyone in the Catholic family parishes, schools, communities and individuals – is encouraged to join in prayer to mark the Season of Creation from 1 September to 4 October.
