Interest Shown By A Parishioner In Parish Finances

A parishioner recently commented on how little was donated each Sunday in the collection at Mass and asked if this was what the parish had at its disposal for the running of the parish. For information, the numbers you see above are not the whole story.

The totals in the Sunday Collection notes above are literally what is donated into the red bags each Sunday. Many parishioners, and others, donate regularly using a Standing Order through their bank. This method of supporting the parish ensures a regular income even if someone is on holiday or unable to come to Mass.

The average total received each week on Standing Orders, is just under £400.00. Further information on our finances for 2023 can be found [here](#)

In addition, HMRC allows the parish to claim 25% tax back from donations as long as you, the donor, are a UK taxpayer and that you pay in tax an amount equivalent to that which the parish claims on your donation.

For example, the parish can claim £25.00 for every £100.00 you donate to the parish, provided you pay at least £25.00 tax in any one tax year.

This might sound complicated, but it really isn't. Paul Whittle, our Gift Aid Guru, can explain everything to you. Similarly, should you wish to increase your donation, please contact Fr Teddy or Paul via the parish office.

It is not very often that HMRC is so generous. Let's be grateful for what they offer!

If you have requested prayers on either of the lists, please can you update them by letting Loretta or me know as soon as possible.

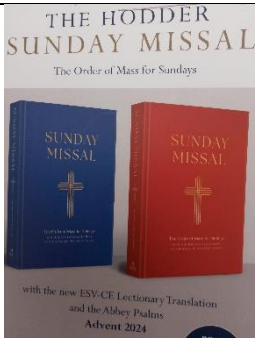
Some of those mentioned have been in hospital a very long time. It would be good to have accurate information on these sick people.

We have just announced our response to the Government's plan to introduce VAT to private school fees from January 2025. Vacancies At The Princethorpe Foundation

Learning Support Assistant – Princethorpe College - Required for October 2024 or sooner, a Learning Support Assistant to work flexibly as part of a team to support pupils who have Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).
