First Holy Communion: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2025 should contact Fr Teddy now. Closing date for applications **11 October 2024**. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

Confirmation: Parents, with children under 16 years of age, who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

Children's Liturgy

This is a special ministry, organised by Clare and the team. Great care is taken to ensure that the way the readings are presented is age appropriate for the children, helping them to understand the bible using their own language.

In more recent times, a child of any age could participate in the Children's Liturgy. This happened because there were so few children at Mass and the Children's Liturgy might have ceased if I set an age limit. I did not want this to happen, and I was unsure how to proceed.

I am sure you will understand how difficult it is to relate at once to children of varying ages when the age gap is too wide. For this reason, the Children's Liturgy will now be for children of school age from 4 years upwards to 10 years. I believe that children over 10 should be in church with the rest of the congregation listening to the Word of God with their family. I would like to accommodate children of all ages but that is just not possible right now.

Cleaning St Anne's – Your Parish Church

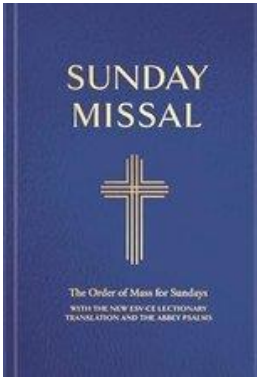
It is not a hard job to keep St Anne's clean and tidy. The faithful few could do with some help, please.
