Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of unity in the faith. Communion is not bread and wine, but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son. Let us pray for unity among all Christians, as God wills. Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar!

TO PARISH USERS OF ST PETER'S HALL: because of the unaffordable high costs of keeping the hall going as it is, we are trying to reduce costs by - Grouping bookings into as few days each week as possible to save heating Removing the Flint and Jeffries rooms from use completely Asking all small groups NOT to use the main hall: the cost of heating that

Having the hall unused for several days each week

huge space for a small number is a waste

Outside bookings will have to be limited to certain days each week only Asking all parish users, provided they have the means, to contribute to hall costs generated by using it.

We are sorry for this but the seriousness of the situation means that the Finance Committee felt that there is no choice. Just as we cannot afford to redecorate the church, or fully maintain the presbytery at the moment, so we cannot afford to run the hall as it has been. We simply must try something to cut bills. On the positive side, it will mean reducing our carbon output too. Again, this highlights the need for the review of the hall and presbytery for possible redevelopment. We need these buildings to contribute to parish funds and not be a constant maintenance drain on those funds. The results of this review should be with us in a few weeks.

ARRANGING A WEDDING

Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Stephen *in person* at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through friends or other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
