**Readings for the Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time:** Our Readings this week offer us rich lessons about seeking wisdom, the living word of God, and the challenge of following Jesus. In the first reading, Solomon prays for wisdom, asking for it above all other things. He says that wisdom is more valuable than power, wealth, and even health. This shows us that true wisdom comes from God and is more precious than anything we can possess.

The reading from Hebrews tells us that God's word is alive and powerful. It is sharper than any twoedged sword, able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

In our Gospel, Jesus encounters a rich young man who asks how to inherit eternal life. Jesus tells him to sell all he has, give to the poor, and follow Him. This is a difficult command, but it highlights the challenge of detachment from worldly riches. Jesus assures His disciples that while it is hard for the rich to enter the Kingdom of God, nothing is impossible with God. This gives us hope. If we trust in God and seek His help, we can overcome the obstacles that keep us from following Jesus fully.

**The Rosary and Angelus:** October is a month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. Please try and say at least a decade of the rosary each day of this month. We shall be reciting the rosary before our 10.00 mass each Sunday this month. After our weekend Masses, we shall be saying the Angelus.

**Next Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> October is World Mission Sunday:** The Holy Father invites all Catholics to support Missio, his charity for world mission, through a special collection. This day of prayer, solidarity, and giving unites Catholics worldwide to share the Good News of God's love which has the power to transform lives and heal our world.
