# "Is prayer your steering wheel or your spare tyre?"

(Corrie Ten Boom 1892 – 1983)

This month in Rome, Pope Francis has convened the second and final session the Synodal Gathering, the intention of which was that people worldwide, non-ordained as well as ordained, would listen to each other, with the intention that, from this, might emerge a revived 'church', people committed in a new way to Jesus Christ. Pope Francis rightly emphasises the importance of prayer in this process.

Here, then, is an extract from his homily recently delivered on the Feast of the Guardian Angels on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, at the opening of the Second Session of the Synod.

"Brothers and sisters, we begin anew our synodal path with an eye toward the world, since the Christian community is always at the service of humanity in order to announce the joy of the Gospel. In such a dramatic time in our history, when the winds of war and the flames of violence continue to devastate entire peoples and nations, there is need for this message.

In order to invoke the intercession of Mary Most Holy for the gift of peace, I will recite the holy rosary and make a heartfelt plea to the Virgin in the Basilica of Saint Mary Major this coming Sunday. If possible, I ask all members of the Synod to join me for this occasion.

The following day, 7 October, I ask everyone to participate in a day of prayer and fasting for peace in the world. Let us walk together. Let us listen to the Lord and allow him to guide us by the "breath" of the Spirit".

You will recall that Monday, 7 October, is the anniversary of the death of over one thousand people at a concert in Israel. I personally hope that we have not become so sophisticated that praying the rosary is not for us. It is this simple prayer that Pope Francis encourages us to recite on Monday or, perhaps, on Sunday as well.

**First Holy Communion**: Parents who wish to present their child(ren) (under 16) for first Holy Communion during 2025 should contact Fr Teddy now. Closing date for applications **11 October 2024**. For older children and adults, contact Fr Teddy directly for information.

**Confirmation**: Parents, with children under 16 years of age, who request Confirmation, should contact Fr Teddy, and those over the age of 16 should contact Fr Teddy direct, for Confirmation during 2025.

### Children's Liturgy

This is a special ministry, organised by Clare and the team. Great care is taken to ensure that the way the readings are presented is age appropriate for the children, helping them to understand the bible using their own language.

In more recent times, a child of any age could participate in the Children's Liturgy. This happened because there were so few children at Mass and the Children's Liturgy might have ceased if I set an age limit. I did not want this to happen, and I was unsure how to proceed.

I am sure you will understand how difficult it is to relate at once to children of varying ages when the age gap is too wide. For this reason, the Children's Liturgy will now be for children of school age from 4 years upwards to 10 years. I believe that children over 10 should be in church with the rest of the congregation listening to the Word of God with their family. I would like to accommodate children of all ages but that is just not possible right now.

Please come and talk with me if you have concerns about this.
