"This above all: to thine own self be true, And it must follow, as the night the day, Thou canst not then be false to any man!" (Polonius in Hamlet)

Halloween approaches. A time when we allow children to 'pretend' to be somebody of their own creation or someone borrowed from another fantasy world. This can be great fun as we include their fantasies and give them sweets or otherwise when we are succumbing to their challenge: 'Trick or Treat'. There is, however, a safety in these fantasies lived out for a while at Halloween. They become 'public' and are 'out in the open'. Safe.

The unformed minds of youth can, however, so easily succumb to fantasies not of their own making when these are created for them and 'imposed' on them through various social media. Messages, images, communicated through social media in the dead of night and through the privacy of a mobile devise, can prove so convincing that they are internalised by the young mind and embraced as 'true'. Another's critical image of self can then become frightening and dangerous as it touches on the deep desire for acceptance.

The quest for personal identity is a natural part of growing up and maturing into adulthood. The fact that the confusion inherent in this quest has temporarily disappeared from media headlines does not mean that it has diminished in frequency among our youth. We had, for a while, been bombarded with 'Gender Identity' issues, screaming at us through every media channel. Yet this quietly continues, together with other challenges to 'traditional' ways of seeing life, to harbour a silent menace to the emotional wellbeing of our young people, including young adults. One hopes that it must not take another human tragedy for us to highlight what is an everyday event in the lives so many young people at this time, their quest to be 'someone'.

The years of youth are to be enjoyed, are they not? How identity is shaped is complex. Yet, embracing, at any level, another's opinion of oneself is always fraught with danger and requires certain maturity. Otherwise, it can hamper the inherent human longing to be accepted as unique, different, and worthwhile. It can interfere with the human desire for genuineness and authenticity and breed a behaviour pattern that seldom satisfies.

The fantasies of Halloween can be enjoyed when they are seen and experiences as just that, fantasies. The reality behind the costume is a human being, usually a child, needing to be embraced, accepted, and loved for who he/she is. Similarly, adult human behaviour can sometimes become the 'costume' behind which adults can hide, because adults are not immune, either, from the desire and the need to be accepted for who they are, especially in their differences.

Enjoy half-term break (if you are fortunate enough to have one) and, if you are with children, ponder: was Polonius (above), correct?
