St. Patrick's also have live streaming for those unable to make the journey. The Rosminian family gratefully remembers Fr Brian and asks for you to join their prayers for him. May he rest in peace.

This week's Gospel – Mark 10:17-30 'Give everything you own to the poor, and follow me'

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.' Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land - not without persecutions - now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'

Welcome to you all this weekend...the world's material distractions have existed for generations and continue to distract us. Why do material things so often distract us from living the way God intended? Jesus was aware of this and shows us the problem in action. The young man in today's Gospel reading is basically a good man who wishes to follow Jesus, but the lure of his material possessions is too great to ignore, let alone let go of. It's all well and good being wise once the opportunity has passed but being wise is what we always want and need to be. We should look at things around us with more objective eyes. It's a matter of what I need rather than what I desire! So, what is actual wisdom? According to Holy Scripture, knowing God's methods is exceedingly valuable. The man comes to Jesus to find out what he needs to do to receive eternal life. A wise question to ask. But he dislikes the answer! He sees in Jesus someone who can answer the question but cannot meet the challenge of the answer. Faith calls for us to see things through God's perspective, appreciating the gifts He gives us and using them to create His kingdom rather than our own. Despite the fact that He sends numerous people to direct and guide us in living wise lives, we don't always get the message. Yet, Jesus, the way, the truth and the life, is qualified above anyone else to encourage us in what is wise. As Peter asked 'To whom else can we go?'. It is up to us to make the sacrifices and overcome the challenges that acting on God's wisdom demands. We pray today for the gift of wisdom so that we may see and use those things and see in those people who are part of our lives, the means to live and share with all those around us real wisdom, and that wisdom comes into true focus when we start not from the things that distract us but from a true grip of the love God has for all people.

Monday morning saw Our Lady of Fatima with the Relics of the Saints visit our elderly community in Gentili House and then on to both the Infants and Junior school where our young children were able to ask questions and learn of the story of Our Lady of Fatima. We would sincerely like to thank Patrick and Donal who brought Our Lady and gave a very informative day of devotion on the Monday and to Canon Gerry Murray who celebrated Mass with us. As the day came to a conclusion it was again uplifting to see the devotion towards Our Lady and the relics of the Saints as school children and parents rushed in from finishing school and work for the conclusion of the visitation. Thank you to all those involved in making our Church look beautiful with all the flowers, it was a very fitting setting for the visitation and to you the parishioners for bringing family and friends and deepening your devotion. We very kindly have been donated by the World Apostolate of Fatima a statue to encourage saying the Rosary in our homes and the First Five Saturdays. We will keep you informed on how we will plan to do this going forward, so that the statue can visit your homes for a week before moving on to another family.









Five First Saturdays

The Five First Saturdays devotion, first revealed by Our Lady at Fatima on Fatima on 13 July 1917, was requested on 10 December 1925, when the BiessedVirgin, appeared again to Sr. Lucia, together with the Child Jesus, who said: "Have compassion on the Heart of your Most Holy Mother, covered with thorns, with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment, and there is no one to make an act of reparation to remove them."

The Great Promise of Our Lady

"I promise to assist at the hour of death all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me."



- What does Our Lady ask all of us to do?
- Go to confession this can be up to 8 days before or after the First Saturday itself.
- Receive Holy Communion on the day itself, in a state of grace, with the intention of making reparation as above.
- Recite five decades of the Rosary.
- Meditate on the mysteries of the Rosary for 15 minutes: this is not difficult, e.g., slowly read the Gospel account of the mysteries, or use a booklet on the Rosary.

Each part of the devotion should be made with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months.
