

THE WORD THIS WEEK

Today we see Jesus offering the greatest gift he could give to Bartimaeus - the gift of sight. It shows us Jesus' love and care for those who suffer. But that alone is not the whole meaning of this story, as the first reading makes clear: there, through Jeremiah, God promises to gather his children into a new and perfect Kingdom, washing away the tears and restoring comfort. Jesus appears as a fulfilment of this prophecy, as the One who brings this Kingdom into the world. But it doesn't end there: we still have the blind, and those who suffer – Jesus' work is begun, but not completed. As followers of Jesus, we are called imitate him in doing what we can to bring that comfort which is the Kingdom of God to all in need.
