Welcome to Mass, and a special welcome to anyone who is visiting. There are refreshments available after the 8.45am Mass in the Dupuis Centre, and after the 10am Mass in St Joseph's Hall.

ST JOSEPH'S ROOF - As we have been watching water occasionally pour forth into St Joseph's church during heavy rain —by the look of it, for some years — our architects came up with a solution - the plans of which were put up in the church in early summer. Although the architect put it out to tender after that, no work could begin as we had applied to the National Lottery Fund for a grant. This was made possible as the main work involved is the flat roof above the entrance which connects the church hall and the church. This entrance is important for access not only into church, but into the hall which is used for the Foodbank and community events. This is what gives the project a 'community dividend'.

We are delighted the National Lottery has awarded us £20,000 towards this, which is a tremendous advantage. Thank you to Nicola and the Fund-Raising Officer for the diocese in putting this application together.

Grateful thanks also for a donation of £500 from a parishioner, and other fundraising efforts are on the go which will hopefully bear fruit. All this, with some more fundraising, will make this very doable. Hopefully work on this can begin before we have any more floods!

THE BLESSING OF GRAVES - The first of the blessings will be this afternoon at 2pm at Hardwick Hill Cemetery. We begin by gathering together for a reading from scripture and prayers for all who lie at rest there, and those who mourn them. Families/friends then go to their particular graves, and one of the clergy will come and bless those graves. It is a simple ceremony, but a lovely way of remembering our departed loved ones in this month of the holy souls. Next Sunday we will gather at Southam Road cemetery at 2pm.

Bishop Richard Walker will be visiting St John's on Sunday 17th October and celebrating the 11.15am Mass. Bishop Richard was Parish Priest at St John's, and for a time at St Joseph's from 2014 to 2020 and left during the days of restrictions during the pandemic. Following Mass there will be a gathering in the Dupuis Centre for parishioners to say hello.

Second reading

Hebrews 7:23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life; you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

Gospel Mark 12:28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.
