WELCOME TO MASS – Today Bishop Richard Walker will be celebrating the 11.15am Mass. As many of you will remember, Bishop Richard was Parish Priest at St. John's, and for a time at St. Joseph's from 2014 to 2020. Following Mass there will be a gathering in the Dupuis Centre for parishioners to say hello.

A MESSAGE FOR READERS AT MASS - Although the scriptures will be very familiar to you, and the cycle of readings remains the same, with the introduction of the new lectionary it will be even more important to prepare the readings well. It's often the case that when words are quite similar, a different sentence structure can make it more tricky in delivery. A number of Sunday Missals have been ordered, and will be here and available from the office in the next few days. They are priced at £15.50 . For those who use apps on an iPhone there is a brilliant App called Universalis. This has all the readings for Mass for everyday day of the year in the new translation - as well as the Divine Office, and much more. It is a fabulous resource for all Catholics.

CATHOLIC 101 – an exploration of Catholic Basics. If you:

- have decided you would like to become a Catholic,
- just curious about Catholicism and would like to know more
- a Catholic, but feel you missed out on catechesis, or on preparation of the sacraments

then this is for you. If this isn't you, but you may know someone for whom this will be of interest. If so — let them know about it!

CONFIRMATION 2025 - For young people who are in Year 6 in primary school or above, you can begin preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation next spring. Please collect the form from one of the clergy at Mass this Sunday or next Sunday. When you return the form (by Sunday 1st December) please include a copy (not the original) of your baptism certificate. Once details are collated over the following few days, then dates and times of the preparation will be communicated by email.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2025 - Application forms will need to be returned completed by today. The sessions will all take place on Saturday mornings during school term time.

Preparation will begin at the end of November, and all dates will be sent to you once your child's application has been processed. **Parents** – it is <u>really important</u> that you do your bit in bringing the children to Sunday Mass (if you don't already). We have Masses from Saturday at 4pm through to Sunday at 5.30pm. The preparation and catechists are there to help you in preparing your children – they can't do it for you! What is important to you will be important for them – and the opposite will also be true.
