

What Jesus did was to put the two together, thus emphasising the essential relatedness of them. No rabbi had previously done this. The Scribe agreed fully with Jesus and went on to declare that true love of God and the loving service of others are more important than elaborate cult. Nowhere else in the Gospels does a Scribe emerge in such a favourable light.
