"No need to repeat the past.

Behold, I am doing a new thing. Now it springs forth. Do you not see it?"

(Is 43:19)

On Christmas Eve 2024, Pope Francis will be inaugurating a Jubilee Year of Hope for 2025. Biblically, a Jubilee Year is a year during which fresh hope is awakened through the alleviation of debts and the forgiveness of all offences.

We are all too aware that the church, as we may have known it, seems somewhat in decline, even 'out of touch'. Numbers attending since Covid are significantly reduced, especially in Western Europe. This, together with the absence of young adults and young families, and the decline in the numbers of 'active' clergy, must surely now be seen as an invitation to 'do better'. Standing still is not an option. Neither is making superficial structural changes alone sufficient. Faith dictates and invites otherwise. There surely is no point in continuing to repeat a past that has shown itself to be out of date. After all, the 'Church' was never ours to claim as our own!

Isaiah (above) and Revelations 21:5 speak a perennial truth: God is always creating, and this Jubilee Year is an invitation to us, worldwide, to become co-creators of a church for the mid 21C. Together, I hope that we will try to re-invigorate the church throughout St Anne's Parish. Much might be new, but not everything. Yet hopefully all will be refreshed. What is good, will be retained and improved upon. What is deemed worthy of innovation will be introduced. What proves not be working needs to be let go of to make room for the 'new'.

This is an initiative of St Anne's Parish Council following a visit to Bourton on Dunsmore and Draycote Open Gardens in June this year. We were reminded of what we have to offer in St Anne's Parish - we could, we thought, in 2025, invite folk to experience the spirit of St Anne's grounds and church. The members of the Parish Council embraced the idea, and now you are invited to identify and name your giftedness to be shared in the planning of the events in 2025.

It is you who will make a success of this Jubilee Year in St Anne's. Some 'events' will be church based. Others will take us on physical journeys – pilgrimages – to various places: St Chad's Birmingham, Hednesford, Baddesley Clinton, Walsingham. The O2 arena London (Flame), and from the surrounding areas to Wappenbury.

In next week's newsletter, you will be invited to actively participate in Jubilee Year 2025. Much will be offered throughout the year to which you will be invited to contribute and/or participate, irrespective of your situation in life, irrespective of your age, gender, health, marital status. Whatever you can contribute will be embraced and welcomed. And everything offered will be invitation. The intention is not to fill the church but to renew hope.

We will reach out to the people of all seventeen villages of which this parish is comprised. We will renew contact with those we have encountered since 2000 with no intention of 'persuading' them to 'come back' to church but simply to share the hope that our faith offers us. Events will be advertised, proclaimed, using whatever media is available: village newsletter, website, digital social media, etc. We are asking our young adults to advise on this.

There is clearly something about this Jubilee Year of Hope that is Holy Spirit guided and initiated in this rural parish, we will simply be part of the Archdiocese of Birmingham's 'vision' (and I am fully aware of how 'vision' is viewed!) and of the Universal Christian Church, journeying with Archbishop Bernard and Pope Francis.

How do we begin? Only in reflective prayer without which this will be a waste of time. We must be clear that God speaks to us in quite simple language – after all, God did this when Jesus was born! I am certain that the comments at the Open Gardens in June, and the initiative of Parish Council members afterwards, was God's invitation. We are blessed here with a Parish Council that listens, not just to parishioners and each other, but to God.

When the disciples asked Jesus "where do you live", (John 1:38), Jesus simply replied, "come and see".

Will you come and see during 2025?
