### Next Sunday - Second Collection for Catholic Youth Services



On Christmas Eve 2024 Pope Francis will inaugurate the *Jubilee Year 2025* in St Peter's Basilica, Rome, by opening the Great Door in St Peter's. Traditionally a Jubilee Year is one in which relationships are restored and past hurts forgiven, and we come to realise and to acknowledge our true place in God's world, and we learn to live differently.

The purpose of this Jubilee Year is to offer hope to a world that seems so devoid of hope. In St Anne's, the "Jubilee 2025" invites us to become 'Pilgrims of Hope" as it has been titled in this diocese, will work to reinvigorate the lives of the people in the seventeen villages that make up St Anne's Parish – in their faith and spiritual lives, and in their day to day lives as well.

During the Year of Hope, there will be a variety of events open to people of all faiths and none, of all ages and all abilities. We will offer excursions to religious sites of historic interest throughout the archdiocese and further afield e.g. St Chad's Cathedral, Baddesley Clinton, Hednesford, Walsingham, etc. and, for our younger adults, to the Wembley O2 Arena ('Flame') in March 2025.

To highlight our year, we will reintroduce the *Wappenbury Walk* – a Walk of Faith and Hope - inviting people to walk from Coventry, Leamington, Rugby and the surrounding areas, to St Anne's Wappenbury on Sunday 8 June 2025. The *Wappenbury Walk* recalls the faith of Catholics who walked to Wappenbury from the surrounding countryside to attend Mass at Wappenbury, risking their lives, during and after the reign of Henry VIII.

During the week 8 June to 15 June, central to the year, a schedule of events, including interesting talks, presentations and light entertainment, will be drafted and published in which everyone can participate. Beginning with the Wappenbury Walk, this week will culminate on Sunday 15 June with one parish Mass at 10.00am at Our Lady of the Angels', Princethorpe College, celebrated by Archbishop Bernard Longley after which we will continue our conversations over a light brunch.

We intend to enhance the use of social media as a way of reaching further afield than just our physical churches and to reach out to committees within the villages of the parish. Initially through email, we will endeavour to renew contact with those who have experienced sacraments e.g. Baptism, First Holy Communion and Marriage within the parish since 2000. A particular focus will be on inviting young adults to look again at 'church', 'faith', 'religion' and to offer us their insights on a church that seems to them not to be relevant in the 21C. To this end, I am grateful that our young adults are actively contributing to this venture at present.

Throughout the year, we will offer *Prayer in the Home*, through inviting commitment from people to pray at home, daily/weekly, for the success of the year and for a world short in hope. Without prayer, we really will get nowhere We will offer courses in *Formation for Ministry*, much of which will be offered online so that people can engage with this in their own time. This will prepare people to enable them to lead Eucharistic Services, to assist at funerals, to prepare and deliver *'thought for the week'* (homily), to proclaim the message of Jesus Christ etc.

The success of our year, and especially of the Week of Hope in June, will depend on you, parishioners of St Anne's, taking ownership of the various events that will be organised. Your talents and skills are invaluable and are needed right now. It does not matter how large or small you think your talents are. Everyone has much to offer and whatever you have to offer is greatly appreciated. Specifically, for example, during the Wappenbury Walk, marshals will be required at various points on the routes; for events at St Anne's, arranging furniture and preparing and serving of refreshments is essential; in an age of digital media, your skills in communication and administration will be invaluable etc.

I am asking here and now that everyone identify just what they can offer and to share that with me or Loretta over the next few weeks. We will be planning. "Failing to prepare risks preparing to fail", as the saying goes. With the guidance of Pope Francis and our Archbishop Bernard, and our joint determination to succeed, St Anne's parish will continue to thrive and flourish as we all come together for this very special Jubilee Year of Hope 2025.
