

It provides a simple digital form and suggested letter that helps Catholics contact their MP to ask them to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law. The second poster links to the assisted suicide resources page on the Bishops' Conference website where you will find resources laying out the Catholic position on assisted suicide, and what you can do to stop its legalisation.
