Welcome to you all this weekend, we have just celebrated a Triduum of Hallowtide...All Hallow's Eve, All Saints day and All Souls day. As you may have seen from our parish's
Facebook page, worshippers have historically fasted and prayed on All Hallow's Eve in order to prepare before All Saints Day. Seeing so many young people in the Church dressed as
Saints and sharing their knowledge of the Saint made for a beautiful ending to the Vigil Mass on Thursday evening. We all receive a Saint's name at confirmation and are called to be Holy; let's remember to pray to the Saints and to read about them, especially the ones we were named after. All Souls day presents us with the opportunity to remember and pray for our ancestors and all the Holy Souls in Purgatory. As we remember and give thanks for what we received through our ancestors, we are challenged to examine our current choices and

lifestyle and to adapt them to be more life giving, and life enhancing for the human family. Remembering also that "where they have gone, we surely will follow" (funeral ritual). Leaving the church after Mass is not and should not be the end of our spiritual lives! Even if all we say in our daily prayers is, "I know, Lord, You love me unconditionally, You forgive me, You are with me," we must continue to feed the fire of God's love before giving Him our day. Loving our neighbour as ourselves depends wholly on how we love ourselves. If our mind and heart are at war with each other, then we are going to show our dissatisfaction with our lives to others. But if we are at peace with ourselves and sincere and honest in what we do and say, then we will be able to show others the same respect - the same love - we have for ourselves. As we encounter other people we must always try to recognise the presence of the Lord in them. Our peace comes from the sure knowledge of God's unconditional love for us; our peace is made flesh in the way we love and accept others. Serving them is serving God. Jesus gives us all we need and calls us to make Him present for others in the way we treat them. May the peace of Christ within us help us serve Him in others.

This week's Gospel – Mark 12:28-34 'You are not far from the kingdom of God '

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' Remembering our Beloved Deceased in November, The Month of Prayer for the Dead

Plenary Indulgences for All Souls

An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, for the departed. It is granted to the faithful, who on the day dedicated to the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed [November 2 {as well as on the Sunday preceding or following, and on All Saints' Day} piously visit a church. In visiting the church it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited. To acquire a plenary indulgence it is necessary also to fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental Confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the intention of the Holy Father while being detached from sin. Praying for the intention of the Holy Father is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary. Second Collection for the Johnson Association

There is a second collection for the Johnson Association who provide for the needs of the clergy in sickness and old age. The Objects of the Association are twofold:

Firstly, to provide discretionary grants to priests who retire from active work through illness, infirmity or old age. Secondly, to make discretionary grants to those clergy on the active list who are incapacitated by serious illness lasting over one month who need monetary assistance to receive treatment to recover their health, and during a period of recuperation.

News from the Bishops' Conference

We are calling on Catholics in England and Wales to unite in prayer and compassionate action to oppose assisted suicide. In early September 2024, when parliament returned and a Bill on assisted suicide – so-called assisted dying – started its passage through the House of Lords, our Lead Bishop for Life Issues, Bishop John Sherrington, called for Catholics to unite in prayer and compassionate action. That call is renewed now as on Wednesday, 16 October, the House of Commons heard the first reading of a new bill on assisted suicide tabled by Labour MP Kim Leadbeater. It will be debated on Friday 29 November.

This is another attempt to legalise assisted suicide and we need you to contact your MP to voice your opposition. Act now! Contact your MP! The charity 'Right to Life' has a simple online mechanism to do this. It takes little more than a few minutes to input your postcode, make sure the suggested text suits your viewpoint and submit your message to ask your MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law, please visit https://righttolife.org.uk Our new Local MP John Slinger says he

hasn't made up his mind so it would be good to contact him on this matter to show our strength of feeling about this. Recently the Senedd members including First Minister Eluned Morgan and Health Secretary Jeremy Miles, have voted against a motion calling for a new law to allow assisted dying in Wales and England. Miles had earlier warned of "huge ramifications" for Wales if the law changed. In total, 19 Senedd members voted in favour of the motion, with 26 against and nine abstentions however, the Senedd does not have the power to change the law on assisted dying in Wales, so the vote was symbolic. Among those who opposed the motion was Plaid Cymru's South Wales East MS, Delyth Jewell. Delyth, the Deputy Leader of Plaid Cymru and an active member of St Peter's RC Church in Bargoed, delivered a deeply moving speech, stating, "My fear with this motion, my terror is not so much with how it will begin but how it will end." Her powerful intervention resonated deeply, prompting the Archbishop of Cardiff asking for her speech to be shared which can be seen on our Facebook page. Pray

We are a praying Christian community and, as Bishop Sherrington says, the legalisation of assisted suicide undermines the sanctity and dignity of human life. "The Catholic Church accompanies those suffering and nearing the end of their lives with hope and affection, but also reminds them that their life is precious until the very last breath," he says. "In preparation for these challenging debates, let us offer our prayers for those facing the end of their lives, that they may receive the care and support they need to live their final days with respect for their dignity.

"Let us also pray for our politicians and our country that wisdom and compassion may guide their decisions. I also urge all Catholics to become better informed about the serious problems associated with the legalisation of assisted suicide."
