Welcome to you all this weekend... We are here to help each other walk the mile and bear the load... A troubling aspect of today's society is its constant focus on oneself. This self-centered mindset makes it harder to love both God and our neighbour. In a culture that promotes self-indulgence, we often view others as competition or even use them for our own benefit. While many people around the world suffer, a self focused society tends to ask, "What's in it for me if I help the poor?" Helping others simply because they bear the image of God offers no personal gain - at least not in worldly terms. Today we see that Daniel's prophecy foreshadows the end of the world, which is a great and terrible day. The end will bring terror, suffering, and judgement for both the living and dead. One of Jesus' roles was as a prophet and like Daniel he does not 'see into the future' like some fortune teller but rather reveals God's plan. He tells of the end of the world when he will come again - as Daniel saw - and the angels gather in His chosen, amid terrible signs and great distress. If some are chosen, it stands to reason that others are not. When will this happen? Jesus says that only the Father knows. What should we do about it? Repent and believe. Between now and the end, we have the opportunity to reconcile with God. The end time is not yet here, but Jesus gives us notice of it. There is still time—but we must make the most of it! It takes courage and faith to reject the temptation to merely care for ourselves. Helping others requires us to trust that God is with us, especially if such activities contradict a culture that considers charity as a sign of weakness. Christ calls us to be nice and charitable. While we may not fear the end of time or our own death, we should fear giving in to a self-centred world that rejects God's love and His call to compassion.

This week's Gospel – Mark 13:24-32

'The stars will fall from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken'

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.'
