Welcome to you all this weekend, two small coins placed into the poor box, not enough to make a huge impact, but the huge amounts casually dropped in by the rich; now, that will really help the poor! However, Jesus praises the widows offering, it was all she had, rather than the large amounts donated by the rich from their immense wealth. Yes, their money will help, but has it changed them? It may hardly affect their bank balance. The widow who is giving up her last penny, will undoubtedly notice it. She doesn't need to change for she is giving her all. We also remember Jesus praised the small boy who offered five loaves and two fishes to feed 5,000 people. That was all he had too. Do what we can and let God take care of the rest. If we are tight fisted with our own time, talents and money how can we expect God to be generous towards us? Jesus gave all He had for us, and those who wanted Him dead did not value His life very much. But it changed everything. Jesus teaches us that we should learn to place our confidence in God rather than in material things. What makes that so difficult for us is that it requires the ability to let go of things, and that requires the virtue of humility. Humility means being able to see where we are before God in complete honesty, which requires courage! The truly humble person has a tremendous need for God since His presence is essential to his or her happiness. Both of the widows we meet in this week's readings valued God's presence in their life more than everything else they owned. These women are outstanding examples of the ideal believer, who has entire trust in God. We, like the two widows and the young boy, wish to give Him our all. We want to put our trust and faith in Him. To do so, we need to be assured that He sees us, knows us, and cares for us at all times and in every situation. If we want to excel at any talent in life, we must practise it. Being humble,

before the Lord, begins in acknowledging that we are sinners and at the same time knowing we are loved, forgiven and healed by our God. Let's make a new start today!

In his teaching Jesus said, 'Beware of the scribes who like to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets; these are the men who swallow the property of widows, while making a show of lengthy prayers. The more severe will be the sentence they receive.' He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'
