WELCOME TO MASS ON THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD.

In the Western Church the liturgy of today's feast, when the Wise Men from the east visit the newborn Lord, hasn't quite the high profile as it has in the Eastern Church, where the Feast of the Epiphany is the apex of all that we celebrate at this time, and in many places is celebrated with ceremonies and feasting which surpass even Christmas — although in countries such as Spain the Epiphany still retains its importance. These is even more the case culturally where Christmas seemed to have kicked in about six weeks ago and lasts, if it's lucky, to Boxing Day!

However, Epiphany is important - for it is the Christmas of the Gentiles! For the Magi, the Wise Men, are those from outside the confinements of the people of Israel who were led by the light of faith to find the Saviour born for the whole world.

Pope Benedict once reflected on these mysterious characters from the East in their journey following the star to discover Christ: They were, he said:

'above all, men of courage, the courage and humility born of faith. Courage was needed to grasp the meaning of the star as a sign to set out, to go forth — towards the unknown, the uncertain, on paths filled with hidden dangers. We can imagine that their decision was met with derision: the scorn of those realists who could only mock the reveries of such men. Anyone who took off on the basis of such uncertain promises, risking everything, could only appear ridiculous. But for these men, inwardly seized by God, the way which he pointed out was more important than what other people thought. For them, seeking the truth meant more than the taunts of the world, so apparently clever.'

'The Wise Men followed the star, and thus came to Jesus, to the great Light which enlightens everyone coming into this world (cf. Jn 1:9). As pilgrims of faith, the Wise Men themselves became stars shining in the firmament of history and they show us the way. The saints are God's true constellations, which light up the nights of this world, serving as our guides. Saint Paul, in his Letter to the Philippians, told his faithful that they must shine like stars in the world (cf. 2:15).'

The Christmas Season continues this week with the season of the Epiphany. The liturgical season of `Christmas ends next Sunday with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

It has long been a tradition that chalk is blessed at Epiphany Mass, and that we take a piece home with us to invoke a blessing on our homes for the New Year that has begun.

We use the blessed chalk to write above the doorway of your home:

20+C+M+B+25

As we do so another says the following prayer invoking God's blessing

The three wise men

- (C) Caspar
- (M) Melchior, and
- (B) Balthasar, followed the star to God's Son who became man
- (20) Two thousand and
- (25) twenty-five years ago.
- +May Christ
- +bless our home
- +and remain with us throughout the New Year.
- +Amen

We then pray: Our Father. Hail Mary. Glory be.

The head of the household concludes with this prayer

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your Only Begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern and care for others may reflect your love. Bless this household with health, goodness of heart, and the keeping of your commandments. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. Our Father. Hail Mary. Glory be.

Entrance Antiphon

Behold, the Lord, the Mighty One, has come; and kingship is in his grasp, and power and dominion.

First reading

Isaiah 60:1-6

Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory will be seen upon you. And nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising.

Lift up your eyes all round, and see; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from afar, and your daughters shall be carried on the hip. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and exult, because the abundance of the sea shall be turned to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come.

They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall bring good news, the praises of the LORD.

Gospel

Matthew 2:1-12

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, 'Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.' When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:

"And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him.' After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshipped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

We have seen his star in the East, and have come with gifts to adore the Lord.

Solemn Blessing

May God, who has called you out of darkness into his wonderful light, pour out in kindness his blessing upon you and make your hearts firm in faith, hope and charity.

Amen.

And since in all confidence you follow Christ, who today appeared in the world as a light shining in darkness, may God make you, too, a light for your brothers and sisters.

Amen.

And so when your pilgrimage is ended, may you come to him whom the Magi sought as they followed the star and whom they found with great joy, the Light from Light, who is Christ the Lord.

Amen.

And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, come down on you and remain with you for ever. **Amen.**
