**Today is Sunday of the Word of God**: On 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019, Pope Francis wrote: "The <u>Second Vatican Council</u> gave great impulse to the rediscovery of the word of God, thanks to its Dogmatic Constitution <u>Dei Verbum</u>, a document that deserves to be read and appropriated ever anew. The Constitution clearly expounds the nature of sacred Scripture, its transmission from generation to generation (Chapter II), its divine inspiration (Chapter III) embracing the Old and New Testaments (Chapters IV and V), and the importance of Scripture for the life of the Church (Chapter VI). To advance this teaching, <u>Pope Benedict XVI</u> convoked an <u>Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in 2008 on "The Word of God in the Life and Mission of the Church"</u>, and then issued the Apostolic Exhortation <u>Verbum Domini</u>, whose teaching remains fundamental for our communities. [1] That document emphasizes in particular the performative character of the Word of God, especially in the context of the liturgy, in which its distinctively sacramental character comes to the fore. It is fitting, then that the life of our people be constantly marked by this decisive relationship with the living word that the Lord never tires of speaking to his Bride, that she may grow in love and faithful witness.

3. Consequently, I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God. This *Sunday of the Word of God* will thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. This is more than a temporal coincidence: the celebration of the *Sunday of the Word of God* has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity".
