<u>DISPOSING OF OLD MISSALS</u>: It is an ancient Jewish custom that holy books and scrolls, if no longer usable, should be buried. Just as human bodies reflect the glory and handiwork of God, so Scripture and books used for worship do the same. Therefore, the reverent placing of holy books in the ground, mirroring the reverent placing in the ground at burial of bodies and of ashes, is not simply a 'disposal' but a respectful returning to the earth, which may be done at home.

He can then check a few facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through friends or other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend a preparation session before the baptism can take place.
