WELCOME TO MASS, especially any visitors joining us to worship. This Sunday, the Sunday of the Word of God, we are called to reflect on God's gift of Holy Scripture. The joy of the people in hearing God's law proclaimed to them in the first reading is paralleled by the reaction to Jesus proclaiming the prophecy of Isaiah in the synagogue. To have God speak to us should be a cause of joy and enthusiasm. And as the letter to the Hebrews puts it, 'in these last days He has spoken to us by His Son', for Jesus is the Word made flesh. Twice blessed were the people in the synagogue who heard not only God's word, but the Word made flesh reading it!

On Sunday morning, Bishop Richard Walker, the bishop for Oxfordshire, Warwickshire, and Coventry, visits Our Lady's to celebrate Mass. This is his first visit as area Bishop to our parishes: he has been present in his previous role as Vicar General. At St Peter's, he will again celebrate Mass but also affirm Paul Milton, preparing for ordination as a Deacon, by formally admitting him to the ministries of Acolyte and Lector. This is a preparatory step before ordination later this year. Please pray for Paul and his family. Part of the deacon's liturgical ministry is to proclaim the gospel at Mass. There will be two deacons involved with Paul's formation present at the Mass: Dcn Leo Poole, director of the permanent diaconate in the diocese, and Dcn Pete Middleton, in charge of formation.

A deacon's ministry is one of charity and the Word. In practical terms, he may baptise, celebrate funeral services and wedding services. He is an ordinary minister of the Eucharist, ordained to help distribute the Blessed Sacrament in church and to the sick. He is expected to have a care for the poor and the needy—as did the original deacons, ordained in the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. Among the great deacons of the Church stand St. Stephen, St. Lawrence and St. Francis of Assisi.

If you can, please have a cup of tea and cake after the 11.15am Mass to congratulate Paul and to say hello to Bishop Richard. *He is happy to talk to any parishioner about anything to do with the parishes*.
