Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 18-25 January 2025

Each year the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is observed two times. The first is between 18-25 January, and the second around the feast of Pentecost when we celebrate the birthday of the Church. These are observed throughout the Church and the Northern Hemisphere, when Christians of all traditions come together to pray for unity as Christ did. This year we will be not be holding a unity service now, but during the second week of prayer for Christian unity between, the Ascension and Pentecost. However If you would like to join in with this week of prayer, we have a leaflet available at Masses this weekend. The theme of the week is understanding the Nicene Creed. For each day of the week of prayer, the leaflet contains a theme, questions for reflection, and prayers that you can say yourself. You can spend as much or as little time on the reflection as you wish to. You can pray every day during the week, or just on some days depending on your time commitments. Let us remember that the Church calls us first and foremost to pray for Christian unity. It is this prayer that will help us all to move towards greater unity and understanding. 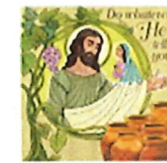

Gospel 'This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee.' John 2:1-11

At that time: There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'

Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding seventy or one hundred litres. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, 'Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast.' So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now.'

This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.
