Readings for the Baptism of the Lord: This week we reflect on the special event of Jesus' baptism. Jesus, though sinless, chose to be baptised by John the Baptist, in the lowest place on Earth the river Jordan.

Jesus wanted to show his support and understanding for us. He wanted to share in our humanity and weaknesses. By being baptized, Jesus stood with those who were seeking forgiveness and a new start. He showed that he was not distant from us, but close, sharing in our struggles.

Jesus' baptism was a way to begin his mission. It was a public sign that he was ready to do God's work. The heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit came down like a dove.
