## The Ceremonies of (Infant) Baptism

Six times during the Rite of Baptism something is DONE to the baby; the essential ceremony is the third, the sacrament itself, while the other five are sacramentals by which we worship and are instructed:

- 1. THE SIGN OF THE CROSS by which the priest, parents and godparents claim the child for Christ our Saviour, tracing a small cross with their thumbs on the baby's forehead.
- THE OIL OF CATECHUMENS as a prayer for salvation. The priest dips his thumb in the olive oil blessed by the bishop and makes a cross on the baby's breast; the word "catechumen" is a reminder of "catechism", which in the case of infants will be taught to them after baptism.
- THE ACTUAL SACRAMENT WITH WATER AND WORDS. Forever afterwards the use of holy water at the church door, at home and sometimes at the beginning of Mass, will be a reminder of Baptism and a prayer for a renewal of its grace.
- THE CHRISM as a reminder of the permanent character of Christ given to the baptised child. The priest dips his thumb in the chrism and traces a cross on the crown of the child's head.
- THE WHITE GARMENT as an outward sign of the Christian dignity and a reminder to preserve one's baptismal innocences put on the child.
- THE LIGHTED CANDLE lit by the father from the Easter Candle to show that the flame of faith must be kept alive in the child's heart especially by the efforts of parents and godparents.

Arranging a Baptism: Congratulations on the birth of your baby! First, parents must begin the process by seeing Fr Arul in person at a Sunday Mass. He can then check a few simple facts and give out a baptism application form. We do not deal with initial arrangements by phone, email or through other members of the family, but face to face. Parents need to attend two preparation sessions before the baptism can take place. Coming to Mass regularly will be an additional help you could do!
