Women's Christmas - Nollaig Na Mbna

As we dismantle our Christmas decorations, the visitors from the East are placed in our cribs on 6 January, to remain there until the Feast of the Presentation in the Temple on 2 February, a reminder to us, maybe tired from celebrating, of the presence of Emmanuel long after the festivities have ended. It is back to 'normal' on Monday, so we say, whatever 'normal' means for us.

The twelve days of Christmas will not have changed our lives very much, will they? The 'anaesthetic' afforded by the distractions of Christmas will soon wear off, leaving us with the same lives as before. Unless, that is, we start "living in such a way that we express to others our belief that Emmanuel has really come and stayed and, looking ahead, that Resurrection has truly happened, too. Jesus, our Urban Shepherd, walks with us in the busy streets of our global cities. When we say, 'Emmanuel God with us' we are not talking about a historical event that is past. But a present experience that continues now and every day, until the end of time". (Very Rev Albert Bogle, Sanctuary First")

"This means that, even in our darkest moments of distress and deep sadness, Emmanuel walks with us in the empty lonely alleys of life's disrupted landscapes. It is knowing and feeling his companionship that stills our anxiety and gives us confidence to breathe naturally. To trust implicitly and to walk humbly with our ever-present companion" (ibid).

In Ireland, this day, 6 January, was known as Nollaig na Mbna, or Women's Little Christmas. Historically, Irish women gathered on 6 January to enjoy a break from household chores while men took over cooking and cleaning the home. Women gathered in pubs and their homes and relaxed, enjoying each other's company and a respite from all the holiday work. In our time now, when domestic violence frequently dishonours women, Nollaid Na Mbna, affords an opportunity for us to celebrate and to honour women in our lives; to say 'thanks' for the many times we may have presumed upon their generosity.

Teaching Assistant, Crackley Hall School, Kenilworth - We are excited to be looking to appoint a suitably qualified teaching assistant, with experience and training in Early Years. The successful applicant will ideally join Crackley Hall at the start of February 2025. This a permanent, full time, term time only post. Consideration will be given to significantly part time and a slightly earlier / later start for the right candidate.

Working closely with the class teacher, you will provide support and assist teachers in the development and education of the children in our school. We see our teaching assistants as a key part of the team in the classrooms, who can have an enormous impact on teaching and learning. You will be a part of the planning as well as delivery of the lessons and will be expected to contribute to the ongoing assessment of pupil progress.

This is a permanent full-time role for 37.5 hours per week, term time only plus INSET days, (36 weeks per year). Working days will be Monday to Friday, 8.00am to 4.00pm including a 30-minute unpaid break (8.00am to 3.45pm considered for the right candidate).
