"That they all may be one..." (John 17:21-23)

Praying for Christan Unity 2025

A glance around our planet in January 2025 reveals just how little has been achieved in the quest for the unity that Jesus prayed for. The thought of continuing disunity among His followers seems to have caused a permanent ache in the heart of Jesus. A further trip through history would try to put the blame for this continuing disunity on the Protestant Reformation of the 16C or even on the various schisms that have plagued the church since its inception.

We sometimes delude ourselves that the early first century church was a pinnacle of unity where "all the believers were of the same mind and held everything in common" (Acts 2:44) and at the same time we chastise ourselves in our tardiness in making progress towards real authentic unity. We pray each January that we might all be one until we notice that not much has changed. Yes, we do communicate better between denominational churches, it is true. Yet unless 'membership' of a particular church community is acknowledged, we do not celebrate Eucharist together – we even remain ever so cautious in the words we use when *inviting* folk to communion or to receive a blessing.

That may sound a bit too harsh because we really have come closer. At least we understand each other a bit better, and we have found much common ground. Yet there is a huge bit missing. Jesus prayed that "we all might be one so that the world may know that it was you (God - Father) who sent me". For Jesus, unity had a purpose – to show to the world which His Father created, that God did love this planet and all in it. That does not appear to be so obvious nowadays because the world seems neither to know, nor indeed to want to know, about God, Father, or Jesus. And disunity, in all its guises, prevails and flourishes!

Could it be that we, Christians, lack sufficient and deep conviction that all disunity, of whatever kind, is really the voice of anti-God, because God is one? Could it be that the evidence of disunity, at local, national, and international level is, in fact, a denial of God? Such disunity abounds in the fragility of one-to-one relationship, in the ever-prevailing abuse of "man's inhumanity to man" in family life, between nations, between faiths of all kinds, all of whom profess belief in a 'God' of some kind? Such that our prayer for unity, Christian or otherwise, is exposed as 'something to be seen to be done', but with no real conviction that any quest for unity implies either a deepening personal belief in Jesus Christ as God and man, divine and human, or with the hope that this unity is achievable.

Praying for Christian unity has been a quest in churches over centuries. However, the above affects you as you read, if at all, we are obligated, because of the prayer of Jesus Christ, to continue to seek, and to work for, human unity as a foundation for unity in faith.

Are you up for this, then? Will you celebrate unity this week wherever you find it, and will you do something to heal disunity where you experience it?

2024 was a year full of extremes. Climate change increases the intensity and frequency of extreme weather events, and we saw lots of them in 2024.

Last year the world experienced and additional 41 days of dangerous heat due to climate change which brought health risks and saw the **Amazon River** levels dropping by 90%.

Elsewhere, the **Philippines** experienced six typhoons in a single 30-day period, triggering landslides and floods. Unfortunately, these events are becoming increasingly common, and they highlight the urgency of climate action to reduce the impacts of climate change on the most vulnerable people in the world.
