name! The baptismal font is often referred to as the "womb of the Church." Every person who enters the Church, as well as every person who is born into new life, does so through the maternal gate of the font. It is a lovely thought to reflect on God the Father's words about His Son, words we hear in today's Gospel, which also apply to each of us: "This is my beloved Son, this is my beloved daughter!" From the moment we emerge from the font and the water is poured over our heads, we become God's beloved sons and daughters. We united with Jesus and become the Lord's beloved. Therefore, united with one another and with Jesus, we are responsible for each other. The Father expects us to treat one another the same way we would like to be treated. Let us renew our Baptismal life and freedom today with great joy and confidence. As we do so, let us also proclaim that we are truly the beloved of God, beginning this New Year with a renewed determination, a fresh commitment, to live as He calls us to live as His beloved!

#### LEPRA 1924-2024

Today, 500 people will be diagnosed with leprosy; 28 of those will be children. Over 3 million people across the globe are living with undiagnosed leprosy. Leprosy is not a disease of the past, it still exists and it is still destroying lives. It is caused by a type of bacteria that can affect the skin, the peripheral nerves, mucosa of the upper respiratory tract, and the eyes. Lepra seeks to provide better detection, treatment and support to those affected by leprosy. With a course of Multidrug therapy, it is possible to cure leprosy and after just one tablet a person is non-infectious. There is hope that leprosy will one day be beaten. # Holy Year and Indulgences

The 2025 Holy Year, which began with the opening of the Holy Door in St Peter's Basilica in Rome, on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> December 2024 and runs to the Feast of Epiphany 2026, is themed "Pilgrims of Hope," and is all about embracing God's mercy and finding spiritual renewal. A big part of this celebration is the chance to receive a plenary indulgence. To receive this special gift, there are a few meaningful steps which can be found in the yellow guide at the back of church. Pilgrims are encouraged to visit key churches - like the famous basilicas in Rome – pray, and perform acts of kindness and mercy. If you can't make the trip, don't worry! The following Jubilee churches and sites have been chosen by His Grace as particular places of pilgrimage in our diocese;

St Chad's Cathedral – Shrine of St Chad, St Anne's Church, Caversham – Shrine of Our Lady of Caversham, Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Hednesford – Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes, St Michael's Church, Penn, Wolverhampton – Shrine of Blessed Carlo Acutis, The Immaculate Conception & St Egwin Church – Shrine of Our Lady of Evesham, Harvington Hall, near Kidderminster, & Bl. Dominic Barberi Church & St John Henry Newman College, Littlemore, Oxford.

You can still participate through heartfelt prayer and by offering your struggles to God. This Holy Year is a beautiful remin der that God's mercy is always within reach, wherever you are. There are Companion Booklets at the back of Church produced by the Archdiocese which you can also purchase.
