From Water to Wine to Blood... Welcome to you all this weekend! Three mysteries mark the Epiphany. Two of these - the Magi's visit and Jesus' Baptism - have already been celebrated. Today, we honour the third: the miracle at Cana. When told there was no wine, Jesus responds, "Woman why turn to me? My hour has not yet come." Yet, He produces wine miraculously, opening the path that ultimately leads to His passion, death, and resurrection - His "hour." In a sense, however, His "hour" begins here, with the transformation of water into wine. Soon, He will change wine into His blood. The water at Cana, reserved for purification rites, foreshadows the Eucharistic wine that becomes His blood, the new purification rite. Thus, the miracle of Cana completes the Epiphany: The Saviour of the world has arrived. Just as He turned water into wine and wine into blood, He is now transforming the world into the Kingdom of God. Through His grace, we are made members of this Kingdom, with the responsibility of sharing the Good News of the Gospel with the world today. Jesus' presence at a wedding reveals just how important marriage is. God is love, and to have the presence of God Himself at the start of any loving marriage is obviously the very best start. It shows also His involvement in human life and joys, as- He is present to celebrate with the couple and their other guests. He also shows great generosity in supplying an abundance of wine when the original supply runs out. And at the heart of this is Jesus' Mother. Who among the guests would possibly have thought that when Mary said to the servants 'Do whatever He tells you' that such wonders will result. Mary knows all about God's wonders: no one has done as much in obedience to what God told her.....

## **JUBILEE PILGRIMS OF HOPE**





The logo shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples. The figure at the front is holding onto the cross. It is not only the sign of the faith which this lead figure embraces, but also of hope, which can never be abandoned, because we are always in need of hope, especially in our moments of greatest need. There are the rough waves under the

figures, symbolising the fact that life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly in calm waters. Often the circumstances of daily life and events in the wider world require a greater call to hope. That's why we should pay special attention to the lower part of the cross which has been elongated and turned into the shape of an anchor which is let down into the waves. The anchor is well known as a symbol of hope. In maritime terms the 'anchor of hope 'refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency manoeuvres to stabilise the ship during storms. It is worth noting that the image illustrates the pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking, but rather as something communal, marked by an increasing dynamism leading one ever closer to the cross. The cross in the logo is by no means static, but it is also dynamic. It bends down towards humanity, not leaving human beings alone, but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope. At the bottom of the logo is the motto of the 2025 Jubilee Year: *Peregrinantes in Spem* (Pilgrims in hope), represented in green.

## **Holy Year and Indulgences**

The 2025 Holy Year, which began with the opening of the Holy Door in St Peter's Basilica in Rome, on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> December 2024 and runs to the Feast of Epiphany 2026, is themed "Pilgrims of Hope," and is all about embracing God's mercy and finding spiritual renewal. A big part of this celebration is the chance to receive a plenary indulgence. To receive this special gift, there are a few meaningful steps which can be found in the yellow guide at the back of church. Pilgrims are encouraged to visit key churches - like the famous basilicas in Rome – pray, and perform acts of kindness and mercy. If you can't make the trip, don't worry! The following Jubilee churches and sites have been chosen by His Grace as particular places of pilgrimage in our

diocese;

#### LEPRA 1924-2024

Today, 500 people will be diagnosed with leprosy; 28 of those will be children. Over 3 million people across the globe are living with undiagnosed leprosy. Leprosy is not a disease of the past, it still exists and it is still destroying lives. It is caused by a type of bacteria that can affect the skin, the peripheral nerves, mucosa of the upper respiratory tract, and the eyes. Lepra seeks to provide better detection, treatment and support to those affected by leprosy. With a course of Multidrug therapy, it is possible to cure leprosy and after just one tablet a person is non-infectious. There is hope that leprosy will one day be beaten. ## This week's Gospel - John 2:1-11

## 'This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee'

At that time: There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding seventy or one hundred litres. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, 'Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast.' So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now.' This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.
