Dear Parishioners

St Teresa's:This last week has been quite hard work for us all with the temperatures so low and getting
about so challenging. I spent three days marooned at home with laryngitis unable to talk
and feeling drained of energy and ambition for anything beyond snoozing! Mass was
cancelled and a big thank you to Victoria at Holy Trinity for " holding the fort" and letting
people know if they turned up at church for the usual weekday celebration. Friday normal
service was resumed at St Teresa's in the last of our Christmas tide weekday Masses.
Before the lurgy struck, I was in The Living Room cinema at Chipping Norton on a wet,
cold and miserable Monday afternoon watching a film that has attracted much attention
and comment, both positive and negative. Its subject matter does not suggest it would be of
much interest to a wider circle outside devotees but it has been voted in the top ten best
films of 2024 and there is a possibility that Oscars will be won.At the recent " Golden
Globes" it won the " Best screen play- Motion picture."

What is this film? It is " Conclave", the thriller centred around the election of a new Pope. As one commentator has written, it is hardly the stuff of general concern...but it has united critics in appreciation of the acting, the soundtrack and the cinematography. Not so for Catholic commentators who have been very critical of its portrayal of scheming and corrupt Cardinals. Bishop Robert Baron, a great Catholic teacher, has gone so far as to say Catholics should boycott it.

I thought it was absolutely brilliant acting and I hope Ranulph Fiennes is recognised at the Oscars...but like Hilary Mantel's Wolf Hall trilogy, it is total fiction with an absurd and quite ludicrous ending! I won't spoil it if you haven't seen the film.It is what you would expect from Hollywood about the One True Church.

This weekend marks the end of Christmastide with The Baptism of the Lord, another revelation of Divinity to follow the Epiphany and the Nativity.All these three feast have jumbled up together in this season over the centuries and today the various parts of the Church and world celebrate with different emphases..Nativity for Anglo Saxons, Epiphany(Three Kings) for the Hispanic and Baptism as Christmas in the East. They all are echoes of The Word made flesh, that triumphant proclamation we hear from St John's Prologue on Christmas morning.

It is in the Body of Christ, His Church still living and breathing with His Breath, that we see the real evidence of God, not Tinseltown's warped and corrupt interpretations. St Francis, Mother Teresa, St Maximilian Kobe, St Benedict's of the Cross and countless more saints and faithful...they are the true Church of the Suffering servant. Yes, there are bad apples but they are a very small
