Dear Parishioners

This last week we have watched the inauguration of the 47th President of the USA, Donald J Trump. To British eyes, the whole occasion was strange, a combination of high pomp Weekday in ordinary time with showbiz, the President relishing it all and displaying remarkable levels of energy for a man now in his eighth decade.

> Whatever you think of the White House incumbent, he is certainly setting about his goals with energy and resolve. Time will tell if, as he has promised, this turns out to be " a golden age for America."

Every new leader begins with the similar vow to make things new, to return to the right Weekday in ordinary time path etc etc. The British and Europeans are possibly more cynical and less trusting than our American cousins! Caritas Social Action Network is launching Catholic Social Teaching: An Introduction, an online course for staff and volunteers in parishes. The programme will be spread over five one-hour Zoom sessions on each Tuesday in March and on 01 April 2025.

The course is aimed at parishioners who are not so familiar with Catholic Social Teaching, or who would welcome a refresh. We will also be hearing from CSAN members who work on the front line of poverty and exclusion, bringing our theoretical discussions to life.
