WELCOME TO MASS. It was so good to see so many people at Mass last Sunday for the feast of Candlemas. Today we are back to the liturgical green of Ordinary Time. This early part of Ordinary Time the Gospel focuses on the early public ministry of Jesus with his calling of the apostles and the proclamation of the Kingdom of God.

It has been good to welcome people to Mass who aren't Catholics. It is great that you are here! For those who would like a taster of the faith, and to explore what Catholic Christianity is about, there is a group of adults who meet each Friday night in term time at 7pm upstairs (usually) in the Dupuis Centre. You are most welcome to come along if you wish.

At Holy Mass there is a point where many in the congregation go up to receive Holy Communion. At this point you are welcome to go up for a blessing. If you either place your right and on your left shoulder, or ask the priest or deacon for a blessing, then they will know that this is what you desire. This is not a question of some perceived unworthiness — we are all unworthy - but, for Catholics, Holy Communion is a sign both of our desire for communion with Our Lord, and also our unity in faith and communion with our Archbishop - and through him with the Pope - the successor of the Apostle St Peter.

For Catholics who are coming to receive Holy Communion, if it is your practice to receive the Sacred Host in your hand, it is very important that you consume the host immediately. Please do not move off carrying the host in your hand.

THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES falls this Tuesday. Some years ago, Pope John Paul II declared that this day, each year, be the World Day of Prayer for the sick. The Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes has been known, since Our Lady first appeared to St Bernadette in 1858, as a place of healing. Mass is at 9.30am. If you are sick yourself, or you who know or care for someone who is sick, try to get to Mass on this day, or visit the Lourdes Grotto outside church. If it isn't bucketing it down, we will have a procession to the Grotto at the end of Mass.

First reading

Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the Temple. Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings. And one called to another and said:

'Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!'

And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!'

Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth and said: 'Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for.'

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' Then I said, 'Here I am! Send me.'

Second reading

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you — unless you believed in vain.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas,

then to the Twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the Apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the Apostles, unworthy to be called an Apostle, because I persecuted the Church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace towards me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

Gospel Luke 5:1-11

At that time: The crowd was pressing in on Jesus to hear the word of God. He was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch.' And Simon answered, 'Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets.' And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. They signalled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord.' For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men.' And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.
