Through God's mysterious design, it was in that family that the Son of God spent long years of a hidden life. It is therefore the prototype and example for all Christian families. *Pope St John Paul II*

WELCOME TO MASS, especially any visitors joining us to worship, today. Today's first and Gospel readings are very much about mercy. David, having crept into the camp of his enemy Saul, refuses the opportunity to kill him as he lies sleeping. Saul, as King, is the Lord's anointed and David cannot strike him down therefore. Jesus speaks of the need for generosity in our dealings with others, a generosity that comes at a price but a generosity that challenges notions of revenge, retribution and grudges. Our generosity must be for all, not just those who respond in kind to us. For, after all, Jesus, the 'man from heaven' (as Paul says in the second reading) comes with limitless generosity to save all who are 'men of earth'. That generosity is summed up by mercy, a mercy for all who bear the stamp of God's likeness—everyone.

Lent arrives on 5 March, and again we renew our efforts to live conquering sin, mastering our desires and caring for others. Following Christ's example, a good Lent must include giving something up and taking something on. There are many opportunities every week to come to Mass, make your confession or pray at a Holy Hour. We may support others through SPAN or KindAid or CAFOD or attend the Lent study Group or say a rosary or arrive at Mass earlier to pray or pick up that holy book and start reading or visit the neighbour we've been neglecting or make that final effort to stop smoking or miss a weekly meal or live more simply or so much else. God bless us all, Fr Stephen

HOLY COMMUNION: If you are not a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of unity in the faith. Communion is not bread and wine, but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son.
