Readings for the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time. This weekend, our readings highlight key themes such as God's holiness, our unworthiness, sharing our faith, and following Jesus through the stories of Isaiah, Paul, and Peter. In the first reading, Isaiah has a vision of God on a throne, surrounded by praising angels. He feels unworthy and exclaims, "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips," showing his need for God's forgiveness.

In the Gospel, Peter, after witnessing a miraculous catch of fish, falls to Jesus' knees and says, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Both men show that encountering God reveals our flaws. Despite feeling inadequate, God calls us. Like Isaiah and Peter, we should respond with humility, repentance, and a willingness to serve, knowing He empowers those He chooses.

Victor Goodwin RIP. Vic passed away last weekend after having a fall. Although for a period he had been in a care home, this was always his parish. Vic and his wife Vera were staunch supporters of our parish. For many years, Vic was involved in the maintenance of both the church and cemetery grounds. Every Sunday for around 40 years, Vic acted as steward and sidesman at our Sunday masses. The family donated many of the beautiful embroidered lectern covers and tabernacle veils we use today. We pray for the repose of his soul and offer our sympathy to Vera and to all his family. May he rest in eternal peace with the lord. His funeral will be in March.
