"Justice delayed is justice denied".

Once again, our media present us with a potential miscarriage of justice on a huge scale. The conviction of Lucy Letby is called into question. The anger this induces in the families of the deceased babies is surely understandable. With Lucy's conviction, they could begin to bring some closure to such an incredibly tragic event for them. *"Let it rest"*, they will say. And no doubt that is what we would wish for them. Yet questions are asked whether full disclosure of facts existed during her trial and whether, in fact, her conviction is safe.

I am reminded of the years during which I sat with one of the Birmingham Six in his 10' x 8' cell as he recounted the numerous offers made to him for early release if he would but admit his guilt. This, he told me, was never an option because he always maintained his innocence. Sixteen years after his conviction, he was released in 1991, a different man to the man of 1975, as his conviction was declared unsafe and was squashed. Fifty years on, the quest for an inquiry into this awful event of mass murder in Birmingham in 1974 is resisted by the government, thus preventing closure for so many.

In the Letby case, the panel of seven women and four men had been deliberating for 76 hours when the judge, Mr Justice Goss, "ended by instructing the jury to reach verdicts on which at least ten of them agree" (Guardian).

This requirement of a unanimous verdict was squashed in UK in 1967 allowing a judge to accept a majority verdict instead. "The research by Appeal, the miscarriage of justice charity, says majority verdicts *'arguably dilute the principle of reasonable doubt'* and have facilitated miscarriages in cases including those of Andrew Malkinson, who spent 17 years in prison for a rape he did not commit; Barry George, who was wrongly convicted over the death of Jil Dando; and Winston Trew, one of the Oval Four". Malkinson's team warn that the dissenting juror, in a majority verdict, may not be the same person when successive votes are taken, leading to a certain confusion. One could question whether a unanimous verdict should be restored for trials in serious cases.

You might rightly ask here, "what has this got to do with us We must surely trust our legal system. Unanimous verdicts may take longer to achieve, and the system is stacked up". Do you think that this is an adequate reason to rely on majority verdicts in serious cases? Miscarriages of justice effect so many people and often leave the perpetrators unknown.

In the End, we will remember not the words of our enemies but the silence of our friends. (Martin Luther King, Jr).

So, am I my brother's/sister's keeper, or should I bother at all about this? Is delayed justice my concern?
