"The Wonder of You"

"When no-one else can understand me When everything I do is wrong You give me hope and consolation. You give me strength to carry on" (Baker Knight, popularised by Elvis Presley)

Much love will be shared this Valentines Weekend. Cards, roses, chocolates, even kisses, may abound as folk take this timely opportunity to express mutual affection.

Yet in the ecology of relationships, much of the obvious can be overlooked. In the routine of life, we can so easily miss the beauty in the ordinary. Occasions, such as Valentine's Day, can remind us of just who is with us each day, who is walking with us through the maze of life, who it is who enables us to avoid seduction into disillusionment without noticing it.

Elvis Presley inspired an earlier generation as they danced to his rendering of "The Wonder of You". We, too, can replicate that as we develop a capacity for awe, an openness to our world, a curiosity inviting a rekindled awareness of the 'other' as a real person different and separate from us. The invitation from the other's presence alone can expand our capacity to be surprised by them, even after many years of togetherness.

This developed sense of awe can elicit admiration as we experience each other as companions. The idealisation of early love transforms into admiration of all that is real and good. The act of recognising the other can eliminate the negative bias – the 'yes, but...', that can so easily insert itself into human relationships. Our memory of past hurts, like a stigma, can interfere with sight of the other's qualities, sometimes paralysing the best intentions of both, thus limiting what can develop into an increased unconditional love, a love without 'ifs, buts, maybes etc'. With acquired awe, a couple can be translated into the realm of a love hitherto imagined, longed for, and not yet experienced.

Jeremiah (6:16) got there before we ever did. "Stand at the crossroads and look", he wrote. "Ask for the ancient paths, ask where the good path is, walk in it, and you will find rest". Remembering, with awe, the 'good times' together – and there surely were many - will provide a counter to the magnet of hurtful memory that wants to drag us back, but back to where? Sometimes to where we do not want to journey but feel unable to resist this magnetic attraction.

Then, invoking the language of gratitude can provide a powerful antidote to this. We can, with eyes wide open, seek to discover hitherto unacknowledged qualities or capacities in each other, such as may have been 'taken for granted' and even presumed to be 'my right'. This capacity for gratitude is seldom innate, yet ready to be trained. We can learn gratitude when we take time for it. This gratitude is much more than words, however composed they might be, or whatever might be the gift chosen to express it. This gratitude is a serious recognition of the other person as real and important to me, as companion, friend, colleague, spouse.

Thus, Awe and Gratitude form two components in the ecology of relationships that can be consciously evoked in relationships this Valentine's weekend.

I wonder, then, what has pleasantly surprised you about others that you will communicate to them?
