I can't do this... God chose the Prophet Isaiah, St Paul, and St Peter, yet each struggled with a deep awareness of their own weaknesses. They felt unworthy, convinced their flaws made them too sinful to truly fulfil God's mission. But God's grace always fills the gaps in our weakness. Isaiah, is given a glimpse of the splendour of God and becomes overwhelmed by his own imperfections, and cried out, "Woe is me! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips." Yet God purified him and sent him forth as a prophet. Paul, who once persecuted the Church with zeal, became its greatest apostle—not through his own merit, but by the transformative power of God's grace. Peter, an impulsive, uneducated fisherman who denied Jesus in His hour of need, was still chosen to be the rock upon which the Church was built. In the gospel Peter, overwhelmed in the presence of Christ and aware of his own sins, simply asks the Lord to leave. How can sinful humanity stand in the presence of God himself? But Jesus simply says 'Do not be afraid...' and Peter is given the task of being an Apostle, sharing in the mission of Christ. Both Isaiah and Peter are painfully aware of their shortcomings, acknowledge that and then the mercy of God equips them to be His servants. God is both the cause of their penitence, their acknowledgment of sin and yet also the cure for it! Like them, we often feel inadequate: "I'm not enough. I just can't do it." We may feel distant from God, but He is never distant from us. His love is constant, personal, and unwavering - loving each of us as if we were His only child. Surrendering control to God can feel like a painful loss, but it's a holy surrender. Our small, imperfect offerings are made worthy through Christ, and in His hands, even the smallest gift helps build His Kingdom. ... I can, with God's help!

This Week's Gospel – Luke 5:1-11

'They left everything and followed him.'

At that time: The crowd was pressing in on Jesus to hear the word of God. He was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch.' And Simon answered, 'Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets.' And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. They signalled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord.' For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men.' And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.
