A blessing on those...who put their trust in the Lord! Today, Jeremiah presents us with the stark difference between relying in God and trusting in man: trusting in God brings enormous blessings, but trusting in man brings nothing. In today's Gospel reading, Jesus completely flips everything on its head and goes into surprising detail. He declares the poor, the hungry, the crying, and the despised to be blessed. There is an emptiness among them that God desires to fill. Meanwhile, those who appear to have it all, wealth, comfort, laughter, and popularity, get a severe warning. It's not the message we were expecting, but that's the whole point. God's kingdom doesn't work the way the world does. Jesus isn't saying that suffering itself is good or that wealth is automatically bad. Instead, He asks, Where's your trust? We may feel safe right now if we rely on money, comfort, or popularity, but those things won't last. A distraction from God's genuinely significant and transformative love and mercy is to put your trust in man, that is, the world and its norms. However, we are on firm foundation if we rely on God, especially during difficult times. This passage in the Gospel is both a comfort and a challenge. It reassures those who are struggling that their pain is not the end of the story; God sees them, loves them, and has a greater reward in store. But it also pushes us to examine our priorities. Is God's kingdom our goal, or are we pursuing the world's idea of success? Jesus reminds us that real joy, real fulfilment, comes not from what we have, but from

### 'Blessed are you who are poor. Woe to you who are rich.'

At that time: Jesus came down with the Twelve and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon. And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said: 'Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you shall be satisfied. Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, and revile you, and spurn your name as evil on account of the Son of Man! Rejoice in that day, and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven; for so their fathers did to the prophets. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are full now, for you shall be hungry. Woe to you who laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep. Woe to you, when all people speak well of you, for so their fathers did to the false prophets.'
