WhatsApp Parish Community WELCOME TO MASS ON THIS FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT. The music at the Vigil Mass today will be led by Fr Guy Nichols of the Birmingham Oratory and the participants of the Plainchant Day.

It was great to see so many people at the Masses of Ash Wednesday to make a really good start to Lent. Of course, Lent is more 'marathon' than 'sprint' and so it takes graced determination to keep a good Lent – especially as the weeks role on!

It has been quite interesting to hear much in the media, and from many of our leading figures, about the Muslim fast of Ramadan....but precious little about the sacred season of Lent. Sadly, the main event of interest in England on Ash Wednesday seemed to be the National Pie Competition in Melton Mowbray. More than a little ironic on that day of fasting and abstinence...but also very telling about our national culture today. As the Christian story seems to become ever more distant from our nations consciousness, we need to be ever more insistent on it – for, in the living out of the Christian year, the gospel message can take root within our families and communities.

We are very fortunate that St John's church is open every day. Do take the opportunity this Lent to spend some time before Our Lord, present in the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle, or to walk the Stations of the Cross.

CONFESSION – THE SACRAMENT OF MERCY - This is one of the two sacraments of healing. As it has at its heart forgiveness, it is a sacrament of tremendous joy..... and yet one of the more neglected sacraments of the Church! There are many Catholics who simply 'don't go there.' Maybe because it's been so long – perhaps since Confirmation – that the thought of it is too much, not sure of what to do, or too embarrassed. Every year people come to Confession having put it off for years because of such things as this. Afterwards they rejoiced having ceased the opportunity, a moment of grace where the Lord comes to them in his merciful love – and not really understanding their reluctance.

The time for us to fulfil our Easter duties (one of which is Confession – at least for those of us who are sinners) has come. Confessions at St John's are on Friday evenings, Saturday mornings, and at St Joseph's on Sunday evening.

Mass Attendance Survey - As we are preparing to move to just one priest in the parish, and the consequent change to schedules this will entail, we are collating views on Sunday Masses, weekday Masses and Holy Days. There will be a reduction in what is possible with just one priest, and so we will need to focus on what we need as a parish, rather on what we want. These were available last Sunday, but there will be some available today to those who missed it. If you would wish to complete them and return asap.

MASS WITH SACRAMENT OF THE SICK – <u>Saturday 22nd</u> March at 11am. Following mass our St. Vincent de Paul group will be serving a soup lunch in the Dupuis Centre. The mass is especially for those who are sick or housebound and find it difficult to come to church. Transport can be arranged by contacting the parish office. If you would like to come to lunch afterwards there will be a sign-up sheet at the back of church or contact the parish office.
