## MARCH—MONTH OF ST JOSEPH. Pray for us, Protector of the Holy Family

The greatness of Saint Joseph is that he was the spouse of Mary and the foster father of Jesus. In this way, he placed himself, in the words of Saint John Chrysostom, 'at the service of the entire plan of salvation'. Pope Francis in Patris Corde 2020

WELCOME TO MASS, especially any visitors joining us to worship, today as we make our journey through Lent, seeking God's love and mercy, full of hope.

Time has always been slightly mysterious. Science shows that it can

move at different speeds according to how fast observers are travelling: certainty we feel it dragging when we're bored and flashing by when we're having fun. Yet we cannot travel in it other than a minute forward, every minute. God, however, is not bounded by time—in the beginning, is now and ever shall be. Today, in calling Moses, God reveals that He IS the God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob, men long dead who experience Him still. So in the Gospel, the vine dresser asks the vineyard owner to give the vine one more year—to give it time. Time is God's gift to us in which we come to know Him and may be moved to repentance by His love and mercy. He gives us time in which we may have a 'second chance': let us use it wisely.
