## **Dear Parishioners**

Years ago I found a book in a charity shop that caught my eye. It had a picture of St Thomas Aquinas, the greatest of Catholic thinkers, on the front, and when I opened it, the opening paragraph struck me and has stayed with me ever since: "Once upon a time there was a little boy with a large solid head and a tiresome habit of asking questions nobody could answer. His name was Thomas and he belonged to the great family of the Counts of Aquin...he was always asking this question: What is God? But what IS God? But WHAT is God? When he grew older and found no one answered his questions properly he stopped asking them and began to think instead." What a brilliant introduction to a simple story for children about the life and works of this most stellar but humble man of God, who asked that question and tried to answer it not only for himself but for everyone else. It is reckoned that Thomas Aquinas wrote or dictated over 8,000,000 words...and he died at 49!

Today's readings give us an insight into that question. At the burning bush the Lord God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob reveals Himself: "I am who I am." Thomas would define this as "Esse ipse subsistens" God exists in and for Himself not dependent on any other agencies: "eternal, uncreated, necessary, absolute existence". Yet He seeks to form a relationship with His Creation...a covenant...which He does time and again through the pages of the Old Testament...and each time it is man who breaks the terms of the agreement through sinfulness and wilfulness.

In the Gospel, we are depicted as the fig tree, barren of fruitfulness, and God the vineyard owner is nearing the end of His tether. But the Vine dresser begs mercy for a little while longer...and that Vine dresser is our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who pleads with the Father through His blood shed on Calvary. If we could stop and think about that wonderful act, the self-giving in love on the Cross, the Lamb of God offered up for the sins of the world and on our altars every time the Divine Holocaust of the Mass is made. Soon Holy Week and we will walk with Him along the Royal Road of His Passion.
