Lent begins on 5th March with Ash Wednesday. It is a season of grace, calling us to reparation renewal, and growth in our spiritual lives. As a time to remember God's goodness and return to his love, all are invited to renew our lives through our participation in the sacraments, prayer, fasting and acts of charity.

Try to attend Mass regularly, at least once a week! And perhaps during the weekdays! Do encourage others in the family / household to do so. You may not get swift response to it, but at least you would have reminded them of their privilege & obligation.

Participate in the Sacraments, especially the Sacrament of Reconciliation / Confession in Lent. Penitential Services will be organized as we approach the Holy Week!

Take part in or organize Lenten devotions, especially the **Stations of the Cross** or meditations on the passion of the Lord, on your own or with family or friends.

As prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the essentials of the Lenten season, do think about restarting your prayer-life, if it is absent at the moment. Individual and family prayers are encouraged. 'A family that prays together, stays together'.

Fast & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
