"What if Lent was about more than 'giving up'?"

"40 Acts for Forty Days"

Once again, Lent is with us, a traditional season for 'giving up', often because it makes us feel better, yes? Yet, there is a rebellious part in all of us that wants to react when we are expected to do something not of our making. 'Why should I?', we may ask? Why indeed? What's in it for me and, for that matter, for you? 'Giving up' can be so hard, and so boring too: giving up chocolate, alcohol, social media, television viewing etc., and yet so necessary to achieve a balance in our lives between mind, body and spirit. Just what do I gain from such 'petty' deprivations? I do so feel the pressure as Ash Wednesday approaches!

So, can I free you now from this? You do not *have to* give up anything for Lent. You do not *have to* fast from your favourite foods. You don't even *have to* pray, or, for that matter, you do not *have to* go to church. But here's the trade-off: you *do have to* do at least one *conscious* kind act on each of the forty days of Lent. You may do much more, but one is the minimum.

Feel better now about Lent, that many of the *'have to do'* things don't apply to you? But remember, this is so only because you agree to be consciously kind, generous, compassionate, emphatic, caring etc. at least once every day during Lent. That includes Sundays – and St Patrick's day as well! Only on Easter Sunday morning will you be let off the hook.

But by then, this kind altruistic way of living will be second nature to you. You'll have found that it was so life giving for you and others that you'll dare not stop. It will almost have become part of your DNA. I don't mean just being kind, empathic etc, but living all these beautiful qualities *consciously*. You will have acquired the habit of living in a radically different way.

Yet, I must correct myself here. Perhaps I am breaking the 'rules' of Lent by telling you what you do not *have to* do. Still, I doubt whether you'll be able to do **40 for 40** without taking 'time out' to be still, alone with yourself (and maybe God?), in solitude, content with self, and realising that there must surely be more to life than the day-to-day routine. In case you're confused, yes, this 'time out' does mean prayer, maybe not as you have known prayer before, but prayer, nevertheless. You may begin to view others in a different way, too. You may come to understand just why God and church matters so much to them.

You might acknowledge too, perhaps for the first time, just how much you matter to others and how your life impacts positively on theirs through your simple 40 Acts over 40 days! You may experience the contagiousness of virtue!

You might wonder about others who have embarked on this 40 Acts with you. And you may look for proof that it works. Then you'll come across people like John the Baptist and his cousin, Jesus. Both are documented as spending 40 Days alone on a frugal diet in a desert, consciously aware of what they were doing, and why. And they both emerged stronger – you'll know this from your school days. How they needed every ounce of character and personal integrity to accept what was to be their lot: both were cruelly and unjustly treated while continuing to live a life enriched with so many beautiful qualities, principal among which was their character and their integrity, never shirking from doing what they knew to be right.

You may wonder just how the character of both could be so formed in as simple a way as spending 40 days living consciously the best of human virtues and values. Then both later displaying the sheer joy of experiencing the marriage between their values and their behaviour, just how each supported the other.

You'd like some of this joy, would you not? So why not commit to 40 Acts for 40 Days, beginning this coming Ash Wednesday – and living each day more consciously than you usually have done. And because this is focussed on others, imagine the change that would come about in our communities.

A simple dab of ash on your forehead this coming Wednesday would be a reminder to you and others of your commitment. So why not come along to Our Lady's School at **9.30am on Wednesday morning**, or later in the day, at **7.00pm. at St Anne's**. Let's begin this life changing pilgrimage together.
