***"I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh"***  
*(Ezekial 36:26)*

In our western spirituality, Lent has been very personalised. "What are you (I) giving up for Lent?", we may be asked. It would be better stated "What are we giving up for Lent?" Or "*What are we (community) taking up for Lent?*", imbuing Lent with a social and community aspect.

In their writings, the prophets of the Old Testament addressed nations, not just individuals. When Ezekial, in exile in Babylon, wrote the words quoted above, he was communicating a God who was addressing a wayward population, people who, collectively, had gone off the rails. Judgement is then pronounced on both Israel and surrounding nations and, while chastising them, he offered assurance that all was not lost through their behaviour. He promised empowerment with a new heart, one filled with empathy, compassion, mercy, from a compassionate God.

Where is our Ezekial in 2025? One who will call a spade a spade, one who will not speak '*with forked tongue*', as the movies of my childhood exclaimed. A secular or a religious Ezekial would surely suffice because we have not heard much direct condemnation of individuals and nations who violate the norms of decent human life. Whether East or West, while a seeming search for peace is broached, leaders strut about *walking on eggshells*, politically wary of making matters worse, careful not to ruffle feathers too much.

Is it not baffling that violence persists while peace is spoken of so often? Is there no Ezekial in 2025 who can '*call it out*'? Because we must remember just how long it took to bring about peace in Northern Ireland and how many died while looking for that peace.

Media now sometimes refer to the present time as comparable to the 1930s and the prelude that decade was to the Holocaust. Politically, extremes are emerging worldwide. Religiously, support for a peace-loving Pope is not universal. Nationally, churches, mosques, temples seem somewhat quiet. Political parties continue their sparing.

For Lent 2025, can we choose to notice, consciously, and to inform ourselves (and each other), of the pattern of events on this planet, while attending to the events impacting of the lives of each one of us as well? We have but to ask and God's Spirit will plant in each one of us a new heart, a more gentle, more compassionate, more forgiving heart, more aware of our common humanity. A heart that will drive us to widen the scope of our prayer to embrace leaders, spiritual and secular, and entire populations. A heart that will encourage us to just sit sometimes and listen to our God. God will speak when we do that.

It was during their lengthy exile that God spoke most eloquently to the Jews and surrounding nations through Ezekial. The challenge, the promise, came during troubled times. In the midst of our world troubles, let us not wait for peace before we pray earnestly for our own Ezekial for 2025, one who may speedily introduce a new peace to our world.

A little story to end, to raise a smile: from our own primary school Ash Wednesday service. To the question: '*what are you giving up for Lent?*', one child replied, '*I am giving up white chocolate*'. When I inquired '*what about dark chocolate?*' '*I am not giving up that*', he said.

A discerning future leader perhaps!?




### New Red Missal Has Got Lost!
