"The only true law is that which leads to freedom"

(Jonathan Livingston Seagull)



My older brother, Jim, died some years ago in Bishop Stortford General Hospital. He had collapsed on his kitchen floor from a massive heart attack and, for three days, as he lay on life support machines, I shared his wife's experience watching him fade away, as one major organ after another failed. During those days, he survived under the watchful care of a wonderful medical profession. While he was being 'kept alive', one could not say that Jim was really 'alive' in any real sense of 'life'. He 'slipped away', so to speak, as we watched, remembering the genuine Jim with whom we had shared so much.

As I celebrated his anniversary recently, I reflected on this event of years gone by. It was a sort of personal Lenten reflection as I wondered just what 'life support structures' - habits, behaviour patterns, substitutes - I have adopted throughout my long life to 'keep me alive'. Some people, it is said, stop living in order to survive. Stop doing what they would dearly wish to do because of some fear or another. Or continue with some self-destructive behaviour pattern because these have 'done their job', keeping at bay a real and indepth experience of self, especially those not-so-nice aspects of self that can induce feelings of guilt and shame.

Yet, we should not fear either of these emotions. They speak to us, as do all our feelings, of some undernourished need in our lives. As we journey through Lent, and as each day ages us, experiencing the fullness of who we are, and letting others know that person, can be possible when we adapt our way of living, choosing to live from the 'house of love' and moving out of the 'house of fear'. The former meaning that we live with the conscious awareness of God's unconditional love for us, if that does not sound too hackneyed a phrase, a love that takes each one of us just as we are. Freeing us from our felt need/drive to 'prove ourselves' to whatever mythical demanding person hides within us and from any accompanying quilt.

Jesus knew that, sometimes during our lives, we would succumb to this way of living. You may recall the seemingly confusing statements He made about 'losing your life to gain it', and 'gaining your life through losing it'. He was implying that risk taking is part of being human. Taking the risk to 'be yourself' and then watching this space!

Here, then, is another Lenten invitation: let others see us, unashamedly, as we really are, once each day of Lent, because we are one of those of whom God said at the end of each day of creation: "God saw that it was good" (Genesis 1). The Beatles sung of this approach to life in "Let it Be" (1970), preceded by Judy Garland "Over the Rainbow" (1939) and, of course, Louis Armstrong "What a Wonderful World" (1967) and, in our time, and for you her fans, Taylor Swift in "Long Love" (2010).

Priests and religious begin their prayer each morning with the words of Psalm 94: "Oh, that today, you would listen to the voice of the Lord, harden not your heart". Can we all invite God to reveal to us this week our acquired life support systems that keep us 'alive' but perhaps not 'fully alive?
