Please kindly accept my email to you expressing my opposition to the Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill.

I live in District & Postcode

Please would you consider voting against this Bill for the following reasons:

Flawed Process:-

There has not been given sufficient time for full and proper debate by all members of Parliament to consider fully this morally complex issue.

The committee examining the Bill took only a few days of evidence. The committee, itself, excluded full and proper representation so that all views could be considered, not just those voices who were predominantly in support of the Bill.

Unanswered Questions:-

Can MPs guarantee that the *scope* of the Bill will not be extended?

Please note that in almost all countries where Assisted Dying has been introduced, the *scope* is wider than was originally intended.

Who will protect the vulnerable from coercion, or from feeling a burden to their family?

When you and I get old, weak, maybe mentally frail, I would like to think that our lives are cherished, and that being looked after by family and loved ones will enrich their lives, as well as making the end of my life, your life, not feel like that we have outlived a sell-by date, or that we no longer matter or have purpose especially on the threshold of saying farewell to this world and to all the people we love.
