THIS IS HOLY WEEK

<u>WELCOME TO MASS</u>, as **Holy Week** begins this **Palm Sunday**. Take a palm to be blessed as you enter church (or hall at 11.15am).

5.pm Mass begins at the back of church for the Solemn Entrance9.15am Mass begins outside the side door for the Procession11.15am Mass begins in the hall for the procession

Today we begin the annual liturgical re-presentation of Christ's greatest acts of love and mercy done for our salvation. On Thursday evening, the Mass of the Lord's Supper where, with foot washing and a vigil before the Blessed Sacrament, we experience the events of the first Maundy Thursday. On Friday we face the reality of the Cross, the work bench on which the Divine Carpenter fashioned our Salvation. And on Saturday night, we celebrate the light of the Risen Christ bursting forth. The basic contents of what we do have been unchanged for over 1700 years—the first travel writing done by a woman, Egeria, a nun, describes the Holy Week worship in Jerusalem in AD382. So we stand in a wonderful historical continuity, making present God's love in every time and place.
