Readings for the Fifth Sunday in Lent: As we get Closer to Holy Week and Easter, our Readings this week invite us



to reflect on God's promises, our journey in faith, and the call to forgiveness and change. We are encouraged to focus on new beginnings and God's mercy. In the first reading, God tells His people that He will do something new for them. This shows us that God offers a fresh start, no matter what mistakes we have made in the past. We are encouraged to forget past failures and look forward with hope.

In Philippians, Paul emphasizes the importance of making Christ the center of our lives. He urges us to press on toward our spiritual goals, always striving to grow closer to Jesus. This teaches us to keep moving forward, even when the journey is difficult.

The Gospel highlights God's mercy with the story of the woman caught in adultery.

Jesus forgives her, showing that God is always ready to forgive us, too. He reminds her not to sin again, offering freedom from sin's burden. This Gospel reading teaches us not to judge others, as we are all in need of God's forgiveness.

Parish AGM Chairperson's report.

2024 was a significant year for Our Lady and St Benedict as it saw the complete repair of the cemetery wall. This followed several months of road closure with traffic management but once started, the work was finished quickly and to a high standard ensuring its future safety. The parish has weathered local criticism of the disruption to traffic and the response to the finished wall is positive.

The work was overseen by the Diocese but the debt is in the parish name. We have signed an agreement to this effect with the Diocese and although the expectation is that the parish will make some effort towards paying off the debt, the day to day running of the parish takes precedence in terms of fundraising.

The Diocese is conducting a comprehensive review of all parishes and their assets and will give feedback in due course. This is relevant to Our Lady and St Benedict regarding the future status of the paddock.

Looking forward the parish falls in the newly formed Stratford Cluster, now renamed Mission which is part of the wider Deanery Pastoral Council. We are involved in regular local meetings with our fellow Mission churches from Stratford, Kineton, Brailes and Shipston as well as those of the Deanery Pastoral Council. Discussions are at an early stage focussing on what parishes currently do and how we might better work together as more priests retire and parishes will inevitably have to share priests. The last meeting saw a request for more guidance from the Diocese and greater liturgical involvement of the laity as examples of the wide ranging discussions.

As regards our own parish, the successful Episcopal visit from Canon Paul Fitzpatrick in June 2024 reflected the present strength of our parish. We must continue to build our community and to work together as we face the challenges ahead.

Ending on a joyful note, we had a wonderful celebration of Fr Damian's Silver Jubilee in August last year. We were blessed with the weather and just over 100 parishioners and friends of Fr Damian enjoyed a long lunch in the sunshine following a concelebrated mass led by the Bishop with music from our parish and Fr Damian's Nigerian friends. It was a fitting tribute to Fr Damian and a reflection of the affection and regard the parish have for him.

Thank you to everyone who in any way has supported the parish in the previous year- your support has been invaluable and we appreciate it. Special thanks to John for his support in Father's absence and to Lesley and Margaret who have recently stepped down from the committee- the impact you have had on our parish has made it a better place to be, thank you!

In our last meeting it was decided to hold a thanksgiving Mass on a feast day associated with volunteering and I think the 28th September would be perfect as the feast of St Vincent De Paul is 27th. We will be celebrating volunteers past and present and would especially like the afore mentioned parishioners to keep the date free!!
